

Non-Degree Applicant Parent Consent Form

High school students applying to enroll as a non-degree student at the University of St. Thomas, who are less than 18 years of age, must review and complete this form with their parent/guardian.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR NON- DEGREE UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS

High school students request approval to take courses at the University of St. Thomas through the Office of Admissions. To be eligible to take courses, students must be a junior or senior (or its equivalent) in high school, submit a high school transcript showing a cumulative GPA of 3.5 (weighted if applicable) or higher, have an appropriate school administrator submit a Statement of Support Form and, if less than 18 years of age, have a parent/guardian submit a Parent Consent Form.

days before the start of each term on a space-available basis. They are limited to enrolling for eight credits during each of the fall and spring semesters, four credits during the January-term and a combined total of 16 credits during the summer sessions. If a course has prerequisite requirements, high school students may enroll in that course only if they meet all the requirements. Although high school students are not classified as first-year, sophomore, junior, or senior, any courses they complete are part of their permanent postsecondary academic record. High school students who wish to pursue a degree program after high school graduation must make a formal application for admission through the Office of Admissions. For these students, like all other non-degree students, a maximum of 24 credits taken at St. Thomas before acceptance in a degree program may be applied toward a St. Thomas degree program.

Non-degree students, including high school students

are not eligible for institutional scholarships or federal or state financial aid. St. Thomas does not participate in the PSEO program. Non-degree students, and their parents, are responsible for tuition and other costs related to each course (if any).
